CHANGES & REFUNDS

Registration is subject to availability and is granted on a first-come, first-serve basis. Lyceum Kennedy reserves the right to cancel an activity due to insufficient enrollment.

We will either contact you in case of cancellation or waiting list, or send you a confirmation email.

There will be a \$50 change/cancellation fee when changing or canceling any activity once the semester has started.

Refunds will only be granted if the activity is canceled or if a student withdraws before the second session. The change/cancellation fee will be applied regardless if the semester has started.

Requests for change of activities made past the second session will be treated as new registrations, i.e. the activity forgone will not be refunded. The change/cancellation fee will still be applied, nevertheless.

If an instructor is absent, a substitute teacher will be provided. If that is not possible, (1) students will have the option to go to After School Care or Homework Help, and (2) your invoice will be pro-rated.

DISMISSAL & LATE FEES

Parents are expected to pick-up their child on time and to sign the release form.

After being late twice, parents who are late at pick-up will be invoiced a late pick-up fees of \$20.

Failure to sign the release form will lead to a late fee of \$20.

After School Care & Homework Help

After School Care (Nursery to Kindergarten)

The After School Care program is provided Monday through Friday from 3:40 pm to 4:35 pm and from 4:40 pm to 5:35 pm for \$200 per each hour per semester.

Your child will be supervised by two professional program assistants. This program includes organized activities.

Snack is not provided.

Homework Help (Grade 1 to 5)

The LK Homework Help program is provided Monday through Friday from 3:40 pm to 4:35 pm and from 4:40 pm to 5:35 pm for \$200 per each hour per semester.

The structured Homework Help hour offers students a place to do their homework with the support of French and English teachers.

Single Drop-in

Parents may register their child(ren) for a single session/hour for the After School Care or the Homework Help. One single session costs \$15.

Please email the After School coordinator at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session. A confirmation email is necessary. Payment must be made by the pick-up time.

Private Music Instruction

Lyceum Kennedy offers private instruction for music classes.

Semi-private music instruction will be charged \$450 for the semester.
(½ hour private session & ½ hour after school care or homework help)

Your child now has the opportunity to learn and play an instrument instructed by a professional musician. Each week, a new musical topic will be discovered and explored. Over the course of the semester, students will encounter concept areas of rhythm, melody, harmony, form and expression and will develop their musicianship, listening skills, song writing abilities, improvisatory and creative abilities, and so much more!

Requests for change of activities made past the second session will be treated as new registrations, i.e. the activity forgone will not be refunded. The change/cancellation fee will still be applied, nevertheless. I shall not be entitled to any refund for any absence or illness of my child from the After School Program. No refunds are made if a child misses any activity. The fee will not be pro-rated if my child misses one or several activities because of a delay in my payment(s). If an instructor is absent, a substitute teacher will be provided. If that is not possible, (1) students will have the option to go to After School Care or Homework Help, and (2) the invoice will be pro-rated.
3. There is a minimum enrollment of 5 students per activity (except 8 for tennis and 12 for swimming). The school reserves the right to cancel an activity if the minimum enrollment is not met. All activities also have a maximum enrollment. I need to register early to be guaranteed a spot.

5. My child is required to demonstrate appropriate conduct. If my child repeatedly fails to behave, the After School Coordinator has the right to dismiss my child from any activity.
6. If my child is injured and requires medical attention and I cannot be reached for instruction, a representative of Lyceum Kennedy will call 911 and accompany my child to the closest emergency room.
7. Late fee pick-up policy: Parents/legal guardians are responsible to pick-up their child(ren) once the after school activity is over. If my child is not picked-up by 4:40 pm for the 1st hour, or by 5:40 pm for the 2nd hour, a late fee of \$20 will be charged and invoiced to the parents/legal guardians.
